# Possessive Adjectives

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In English, we use possessive adjectives to express possession or ownership of something.

Every pronoun has a possessive adjective:


Subject Pronoun	Possessive Adjective
I	My
You	Your
He	His
She	Her
We	Our
They	Their
It	Its



# Possessive Adjectives

Here are some examples:

**My** book is on the table



**Your** earrings are beautiful



She is washing **her** hair



He broke **his** arm



That is **our** house

# Imperatives

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We use them to give an instruction or to make a request.

For example:

Please, be quiet.

Close the door!

Sit down!

We don't use the present continuous when using imperatives.

Stand up, please



Standing up, please.



We often omit the subject of the sentence when using imperatives:

Enjoy it!



You enjoy it!
