Quick review

Use of Can / Can't

- We use "can" to express abilities.

For example:

"A spider can climb"

- We use "can't" to express lack of abilities.

For example:

"Snakes can't fly"

Use of “Do / Does”

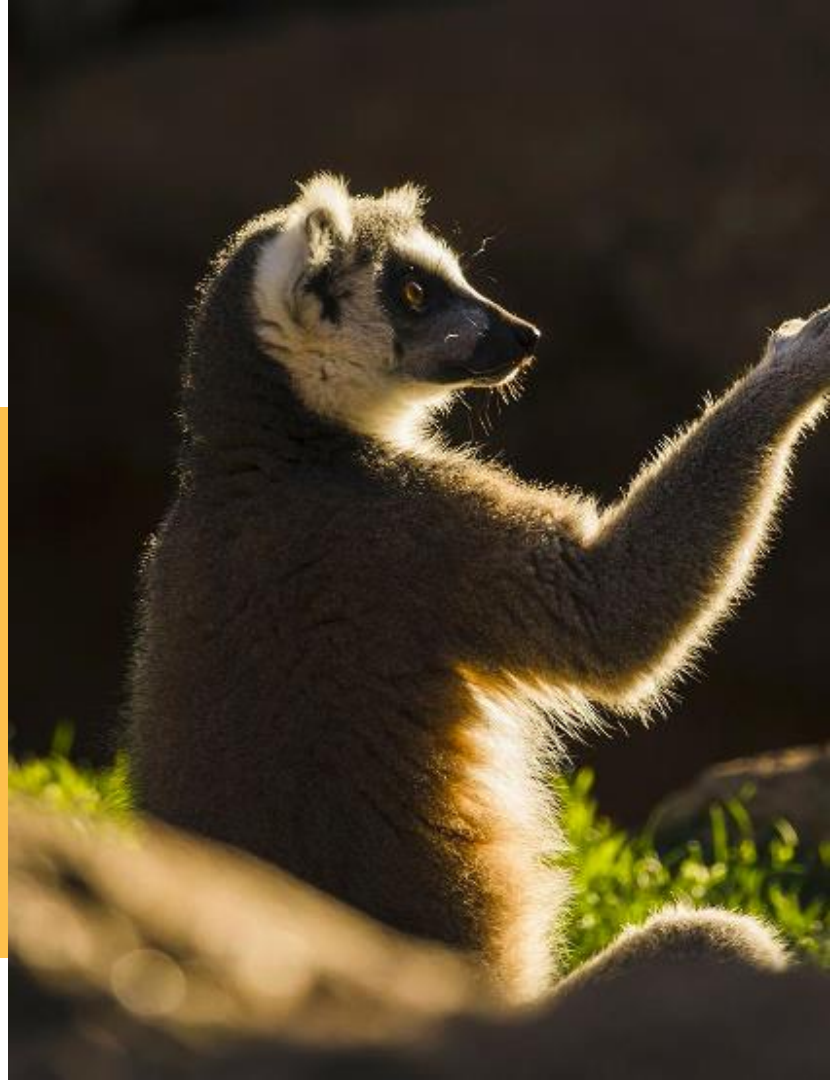
- We use “Do” to ask questions for 2 or more animals.

For example:

“Do eagles fly?”

The answer might be:

- Yes, they do.
- No, they don't.



Use of “Do/Does”

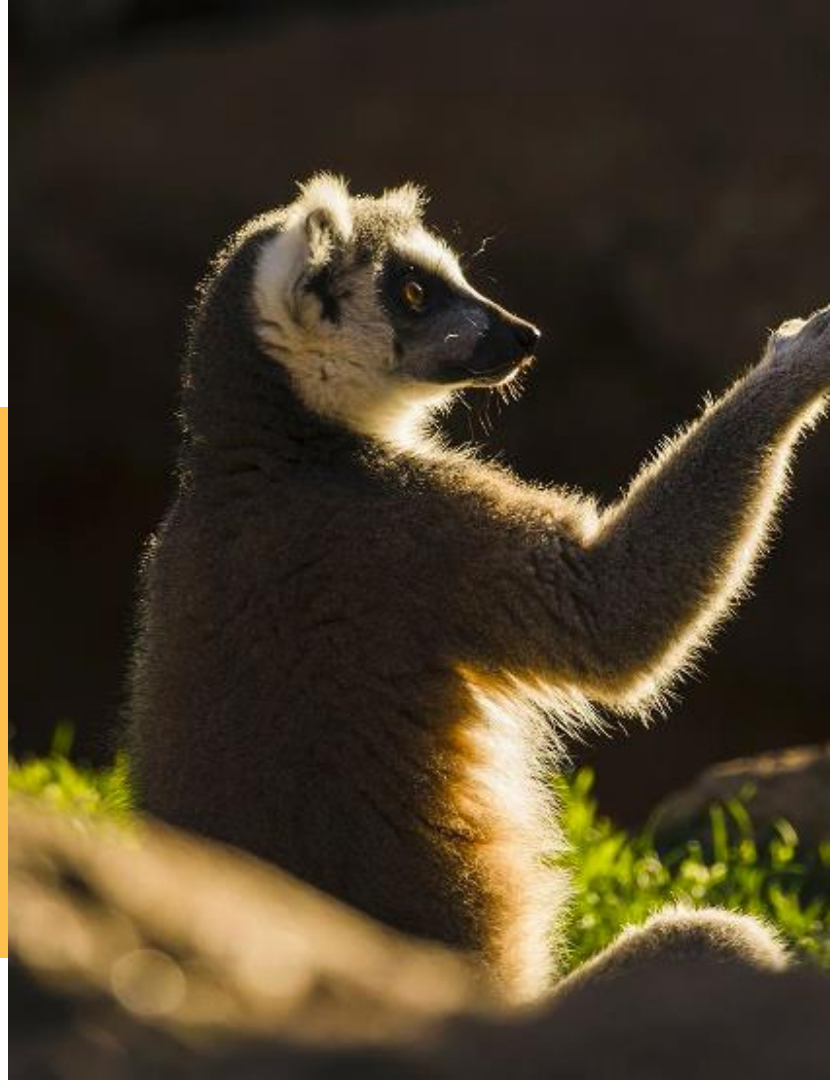
- We use “Does” to ask questions for 1 animal.

For example:

“Does a fish fly?”

The answer might be:

- Yes, it does.
- No, it doesn't.
